1) Problem characterisation

What is the urgency of this issue?

Are the relevant technologies mature, evolving or unproven, technologies?

Are the technologies rapidly evolving?

Complexity

How complex is it?

Who is/will be affected by this issue? (individual/society)

Potential impact of the technology on society

Other impacts of the issue

Are there any ethical issues and implications?

Do affected actors have information about potential ethical issues?

3) Relevance of TA

Why should the issue be studied through TA?

Is there a need for TA?

Would a TA provide a new perspective and added values?

Is the issue complex?

Would those who must address the issue be better informed following a TA?

Input

Is reliable expertise available?

Is reliable information available?

What type and quality of information is required to complete a TA?

Who can provide the requiredknowledge?

Is an interdisciplinary approach required?

What is the quality of the available relevant knowledge?

Out-put

What kind of output is required (if known)?

What stakeholders will benefit from the work?

Who are the clients?

How can we produce useful and understandable outputs?

Objectives/impact of TA

What impact do we need to achieve?

How would we measure impact?

Policy relevance

What is the state of the legislation? Will new legislation be required to address the issue?

Did we have experience with this issue?

External resources

Do we have the network required to carry out the work?

Funding

Who might fund the project?

Do we have or can we secure the funds required to undertake the TA?
